

## ON SATURDAY NOVEMBER 6, 2004

From 8 am to 4 pm

Usually a person that signs up works a short, but productive shift of about 4 hours. . Shift one is from 8am to noon, and shift two is from noon to 4 pm. We have six intersections that we cover and it usually takes two persons to handle the corner. If you do the math we will require at least 24 persons (knights, wives and children 18 or older) to handle the day. We have 190 members of our council.....IF we get 48 persons it will lessen the shift time to 2 hours per person. That has always been a wish but not a reality for some reason Maybe we can change that this year.

If you can't work on the streets you can volunteer to help count and bag the money,  
we need help with that from about 11 am to 4pm

Sign up will begin at the September 19 meeting..but you can always call John Bolger at home (264-3129 ) or work (259-9002) and volunteer your time for a shift.

But beware, I may be calling you if I haven't heard from you by mid October.

### Shining Armor Award

As a recognition program, the Shining Armor Award program is for all new Knights. To qualify for this award, newly recruited Knights during their first year of membership must:

- Attend at least three monthly meetings
- Actively participate in three service activities
- Meet with the council's insurance representative
